Tagore valued freedom of thought and several of his stories show how crushing traditional schooling can be. He also urged the need for educating the girl-child and giving her a good chance in life. While he wrote against the persistence of superstitions, he also believed in the supernatural, sometimes even using the planchet to call up spirits of the many who had departed from his life.
