Since that time over 370 meetings have been convened with arts and cultural organizations, neighborhood residents and property owners, representatives of constituent organizations having an interest in the Midtown Cultural District, and elected officials. In October of 1986 the expanded and diverse community group formally convened as the Midtown Cultural District Task Force, followed in 1987 by formal designation as the Citizens Advisory Committee for the Midtown Cultural District. Community meetings and briefings covered issues such as creating cultural facilities, providing growth opportunities for Chinatown, historic preservation and reuse of existing buildings and theaters, transportation access, open space planning, workforce planning, environmental impact, building height and density, district urban design, day care, building affordable housing and neighborhood business opportunities.
