The Lushais, or more accurately the Mizcs, like so many other hill people in North East India, took up arms and fought the British for six years before they were finally pacified. This Study also highlights their fears of what Colonial would mean for their traditional way of life. Hence their decision to resist. The work is rounded off by an Account of what came to be called indirect rule, that is, British rule through the medium of the chiefs, the utility of which system was realised during the operations and which the colonial rulers scrupulously followed till the end of their rule.
