And while Copper, Bronze, and Iron Ages refer to specific periods in which these metals led technology, "golden ages" have only existed in the human imagination, notes archaeologist Hans-Gert Bachmann in this sumptuously illustrated tour of gold in the world's societies. In page-filling closeup images of golden jewelry and gilded rooms, Roman coins and Egyptian masks, medieval coffers and modern art, Bachmann takes us from the discovery of the "sun metal" in prehistoric times through its use in the ancient world, Islamic and Asian cultures, and alchemy, to the modern day. 280.
